Eligibility: Students currently enrolled in college or high school (contest is open to home-schooled entrants)—but please note that *all applicants must be registered to attend 2010 FDLS in order to be eligible.*

Award: One fully paid 21st Century Abolitionist 3-Day Conference Package to 2010 FDLS. FDLS will also award up to five (5) stipends in the amount of \$100 for students to attend FDLS. Winners will be decided by panel of judges appointed by the Frederick Douglass Foundation’s Board of Governors.

Deadline: Postmarked by Monday, February 15, 2010
